Summary of Panel Discussion and Workshop:

- The Human Right of Peace presented in the Luarca Declaration is in the process of being presented internationally.
- It is the third solidarity pact on rights
- In the history of Latin American countries, marred by seemingly constant civil wars, the human right to peace has not been respected and the human rights of the people have been violated. There are still many cases of impunity, corruption, and social repression.
- The cry for the excluded is a popular peaceful manifestation in which a cry is given for all the injustices, situations of poverty, environmental degradation, etc. that are present in the world. The goal is to fight for a world that we want to see.

Principal Points of Agreement and Recurring Themes:

With the Human Right of peace, living conditions are improved, the security of individuals both in their places of origins and as migrants is better ensured. Peace is the creation of social justice and equality.

Measures Proposed:

- Create networks of action that can help prevent injustices.
- The law should be considered by the legislators of the different countries, modified and integrated into their own legal systems.
